Spotlight on keeping children safe

At Harting School, we continue to aim to keep children safe. We train annually to update our knowledge whilst our Designated Safeguarding Leads, Fiona Mullett and Cathy Day (Suzanne Fielder from September) share information from termly briefings.

In addition to this, we follow guidance on recruitment of staff and volunteers. Governors and some of the staff have completed safer recruitment training and we always make official checks on adults who are regularly in contact with our children.

It would be good to ensure that every child has adults, both at home and in school, that they can share any concerns with - you may wish to talk this through with your child.




This was followed by an interview by the
