Following staff training sessions, we are now using the new Learnpads. These are the educational equivalent of i-pads with software that means that every child starts each lesson with a similar screen, prepared and enabled by the teacher. They are a wonderful resource.

Last year's e-safety workshop highlighted the need to be really vigilant at home with technology. The leaders illustrated that many parents were unaware of the increased accessibility to the internet by the children of today. Be aware that they can get on to the web through TVs, telephones, along with many other appliances such as games consoles. Most of these do have their own parental controls which can be set using the instructions that come with them on purchase. We have heard of a couple of families whose children have explored the internet and seen sites that their parents would have not chosen. It would be good to check the machines in your homes to ensure that your children are seeing just what you would wish them to see.
