## Message from the Head

I hope that you have all had a lovely Summer break and that the new academic year proves to be very happy for everyone. We welcome back all our old friends as well as new children. We hope that they settle in really quickly and both parents and children soon feel part of our school family.

The coming term promises to be filled with interesting learning opportunities - the teachers have spent plenty of time working on an engaging curriculum. Topics for this term are:

Rother- 'Carnival of the Animals' followed by 'Oi, Get Off My Train!' These broad topics are used as a stimulus and are further developed to reflect the children's interests. This is regarded as good Early Years' practice.

Warren - 'Dungeons and Dragons' will be a History led theme. After half-term, the topic changes to 'Fire! Fire!' which is more Science based. Again, children influence the direction of the topic when involved in the learning.

Downlands - 'The Flintstones' and 'Asterix and Friends' will enable learning about the Stone Age and Roman civilisations. There will be plenty of links with others subject other than History, including Art work. Forest Schooling will be offered to year 3 pupils this term.

Torberry - 'Around the World in 80 Days' will allow comparison between countries all over the world. There are opportunities to link this topic with DT and PE as well as Geography.

Beacon - 'Rulers and Tyrants' will include the study of Islamic civilisations, linking History and RE. There will be further aspects of History taught from other times and places.

If you are interested in finding out more, there are maps of our subject planning on the school website.

I look forward to seeing children immersed in their new topics and the school buzzing with excited learners.

#### Library books

We have just spent a large sum of money on library books so there is plenty for the children to read. This is instead of using the library service which cost us over £1000 per year. We ask, therefore, that parents help keep a track of books that go home and that they are replaced if lost or damaged. This will help us to continue to have a really well stocked library for all to enjoy. We thank you for your support with this - we want the children to love and cherish books.

#### Clubs

I am delighted that we are able to offer a range of staff led clubs, as usual this term. Unlike several other local schools, these will continue to be free.

We now have a new pottery teacher to run clay club, which is really exciting. For this club, we will be charging £5 per session to cover costs. Sadly the demands on the school budget are such that we have to ensure that we are not dipping into the general 'pot' for clubs, which incur a cost, so can no longer subsidise them. This means that there will be a nominal charge for Art Appreciation club (£2.50 per session) and Music club, with Nicky Bennison, (£5 per session). Aspire coaching will continue to be £48 per term.

We will be asking for payment for the half-term in advance so that we are assured of the income for staffing costs. We thank you for prompt payment, once your child has been allocated a place. We are still finalising some of the club days but hope to send out club letters at some point next week.

## PTFA

The first meeting of the PTFA will be held at the White Hart Pub on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September @ 9am (tbc): an opportunity for coffee, catch up and to pencil dates in the diary. We will be looking for a new Chair who will be supported by Lyndsay Bhattacharjee (in the background) who has headed the team for the last two years. Equally, the PTFA has evolved so that specific events are led by those who are familiar with them, which makes being the Chairperson less onerous.

Please do come to the meeting and consider if you might be the one to head up the team.

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## Free school meals

Although all infants (Reception - year 2 pupils) are offered free school lunches, it would really help the school budget if you are eligible for free school meals to let us know and apply. The office staff is happy to support, in confidence, anyone to make such an application.

Eligibility for free school meals:

## Is Your Child Eligible for Free School Meals?

Pupil Premium Grants are given to schools to support children whose parents fit the criteria below:

- Universal Credit
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income of £16,190 or less, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs

It also means that they can have free school meals. Currently all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 have these automatically but we still need parents to apply so that the children benefit from the extra funds in school. If you think you may meet any of the requirements (listed above), the office will be happy to help you complete an application form, in confidence.

## Lunch staff

Sadly, Charlene Gaunt, who has been a lovely lunch supervisor will be leaving, later this month, to enable her to work more hours than the school can offer. This means that we are looking for someone to replace her. The role is five days a week (11.45am-1.15pm). Should you be interested or know someone who might be suitable, do drop in to talk about the position.
