Spotlight on safeguarding

In the past, we know that some children have gained access to Grand Theft Auto at home. I naively had no knowledge of the game but now know that it is an action-adventure video game where players control criminals to complete unlawful missions. As the game progressed a narrative was added which makes the player believe that they have become the character who is breaking the law - encouraging gamers to complete criminal acts. It includes profane language, sex and violence. It is accessible through PlayStation, Xbox, desktops, PSP, Nintendo DS and mobiles.
