## Message from the Head

---

School budgetary constraints managed to eclipse Brexit news a couple of weeks ago as many Heads shared their concerns with parents. Like other schools, we have had to budget really carefully but remain solvent for a variety of reasons. Cuts, in real terms, do have an effect but in many ways austerity measures in other sectors make things really difficult for schools too.

The government flags up the need for schools to support children's mental well-being. We do this through paying for some play therapy provision; having a Learning Mentor; and by upholding a caring ethos.

Health service providers do struggle to provide early care for children with mental health needs so we aim to avoid making their time at primary school highly stressful and support all pupils. It would be so much easier if other support, from outside agencies, was available more readily.

We do, however, allocate most of our funds to staffing and choose experienced, capable staff. Of course, it would be lovely to have more. I hold on to the fact that our class sizes remain relatively small and that everyone within the school is extremely committed to the children's welfare and learning, with which I hope you agree.

If you have suggestions to help or have access to resources that would benefit the school we would be pleased to hear from you.
