Message from the Head

I am delighted to share with you the outcome of a recent church inspection, referred to by schools as 'SIAMS'. Since we were last inspected six years ago, the criteria for the such inspections have changed dramatically - a 'toolkit' portfolio had to be developed to share with the inspector. Although delightful, our inspector was really rigorous yet has recognised some of the strengths of the school.

The highlights of the report include:

- Recognition that the values of 'love and respect' underpin all that we do at school. I
 reckon that if we show this to each other, our community will be harmonious and
 those interviewed expressed that it is a 'happy school'
- Evidence that respect extends to tolerance for all belief systems and that we are seen to be inclusive of all comers

What I'm not sure is evident, in the report, is that there is no coercion related to Christianity or prayer - I consider this to be really important. Children always have the opportunity to have moments of reflection or pray in 'assemblies' - we endeavour to teach children to respect the choices of others, which is part of our ethos. Nevertheless, we are pleased that we provide children with times when they can learn about Christian values (regarded by most as a good moral code). Equally, children have time to pause in the day to 'talk to God' if they so wish.
