Spotlight on safeguarding



Information from West Sussex:

'Please be aware of the site named Omegle. Omegle is a free social networking website in which users are connected with strangers so that they can chat via audio, video or texts.

The headline for Omegle is "Talk to strangers". Some children find chatting to different people online to be exciting and fun, but with this comes a high risk of users

encountering sexual content and other dangers such as grooming and sexual exploitation.'

PSHE curriculum

RSE is taught within the personal, social, **health** and economic (PSHE) education curriculum. Biological aspects of RSE are taught within the science curriculum. Relationships education focuses on teaching the fundamental building blocks and characteristics of positive relationships including:

- Families and people who care for me
- Caring friendships
- Respectful relationships
- Online relationships
- Being safe
- Reproduction

These areas of learning are taught within the context of family life taking care to ensure that there is no stigmatisation of children based on their home circumstances, along with reflecting sensitively that some children may have a different structure of support around them.

As a church school, all aspects of our curriculum reflect the desire to respect others, rather than ascribing a theological slant to learning.

The PSHE curriculum route map, is being further reviewed by teachers in the next few weeks as we have included elements which may be less relevant to our children. If you wish to add your views, please do so by sending an email to the school office (entitled RSE) before 20.10.20.

Rucksacks – to stay at home, please

We are discouraging children from bringing large bags to school as we need to minimise the volume of items going between homes and school. Book bags, lunchboxes and coats, should be sufficient.

With this in mind, we would urge you not to buy the rucksacks, available from our uniform supplier, unless they are for out of school use. We were unaware that these were being produced!
