Muddy children!

I apologise for increasingly muddy shoes! Having had conversations with the children, we have decided that the healthiest playtimes are for them to use most of the space available for play.

The DfE require us to keep 'bubbles' of children together and avoid crossing over, as much as possible, which proves quite difficult. As you will have noticed, we have zoned the outdoor spaces to maintain these class groups. Areas are used in rotation and changed weekly.

When the field was very damp, we were restricting the children to the artificial grass and gazebo, which meant the older children felt very cramped. On this basis, the older children have agreed to take off their shoes as they enter school after playtimes and clean their own shoes at home, so they can be on the field too!!

Spotlight on safeguarding – information from West Sussex digital team

Are you a 'sharent'? Many children's digital footprint starts before birth nowadays with ultrasounds, birth dates, etc, being posted online on social media platforms for others to view and 'like'. A recent article, from West Sussex digital team indicates risks for you to consider:

• Innocent photos, if in the wrong hands, can mean that they are uploaded to other websites without your permission; identities are stolen; or something later embarrasses your child

To minimise these risks, recommendations include:

- Avoid location tagging images
- Avoid use of the school name
- Use master privacy settings so that your posts are not in the public domain
- Review what is about to being posted beforehand to ensure that a comment isn't taken out of context
- Check older children are happy with your posts beforehand
- Avoid sharing posts/photos of your children

Much of this may be obvious to many of you but it is always worth sharing to avoid risks to any of our children.

Birthday treats via school

Unfortunately, in this COVID climate we need to continue to minimise the risk of its spread. On this basis, we ask that you no longer send sweets or treats (even if wrapped) to be distributed to the children's classmates on a child's birthday.

For some families this will be a relief as they find it difficult to refuse their child such treats, which they did not choose for their child to have, so we will review this at the end of the academic year when things may be clearer from a COVID perspective. At least this way, it will feel fairer to the children.

Texting app – nearly there!

We are really grateful to all of you who have signed up to the new App. It will make a significant difference to the costs of the system and ensure that we have an additional way of communicating with you all. Thank you!

If your child is in Year 3, 4, 5 or 6 and would like the Christmas lunch, please order it online at <u>www.mealselector.co.uk</u> The cost is £2.35 and it must be ordered by **Sunday 29th November**. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions, we will not be accepting any cash orders.
