## IMPORTANT - COVID-19

If any of the children or staff develop symptoms of COVID and/or have a positive test, please inform the school via the email address on the school website. This is so that anyone at possible risk can be informed. Thank you for your help with this. Here is the guidance:

- Where a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school should not be contacted. Parents and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.
- For the first 6 days after teaching ends, if a pupil or staff member tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising selfisolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school. Please contact school
- School staff are not asked to remain on-call or conduct any contact tracing more than 6 days after the final day of teaching ie Thursday, 24<sup>th</sup> December.
