Share, double and halve them.</p> <p>Measure your bean.</p> <p>How tall are you and all of your family? Can you put everyone in size order?</p> <p>Compare the size of hands and feet. Draw and cut around them.</p> <p>Set up a pretend garden centre at home and play shops</p>	
<p><u>Expressive arts and design.</u></p> <p>Plan your perfect garden.</p> <p>Make a giant's castle out of junk.</p> <p>Use seeds to create a picture.</p> <p>Make a picture using leaves, petals, and other natural things that you find in you garden.</p> <p>Make up some music to help you plants grow.</p> <p>Make a musical instrument out of junk eg shakers with rice.</p> <p>Design flower seed packets to sell in a pretend shop</p> <p>Design and make a miniature garden</p> <p>Sketching real plants/ trees</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Growing</p> 	<p><u>Knowledge and Understanding of the world</u></p> <p>Plant seeds, use egg boxes, plastic containers, jars - whatever you have.
