# Message from the Head

We have been working with the Rother Valley for more than a decade. This is a group of 15 local schools – all in West Sussex and rated 'Good' by Ofsted – with whom we collaborate. There is a memorandum of understanding so we all contribute into a fund for shared work, now there is no locality funding from the local authority. Examples of this include audits across the schools at Headship level, known as Peer to Peer reviews; shared inset training; subject leaders collaborate and share practice at meetings; assessments are 'moderated' by teachers across schools'; and the Special Educational Needs Coordinators (SENCOs) have regular forums to update their knowledge with a Hub to support this work. The strong relationships enable children in small schools to have wider experiences, supported by a range of expertise. Additionally, the governors work together led by our Chair, Jeff Ace.

Stedham School is one of the Rother Valley Schools. Recently, our governors agreed to move towards a closer working partnership with it. There will, however, be no change in our school's staffing structure and we will continue to be two separate schools with our own budgets and leadership. It will enable shared training opportunities and stronger collaboration, to benefit all the children. We really look forward to sharing our knowledge and developing our skills alongside them.

# Curriculum and the 'Big Question'

At this point, you should have received an overview of learning from your child's class teacher for the term. If you require additional information, do look at the website for more detail.

Research tells us that knowledge aids learning so our curriculum is designed to build this, as well as progress learners' skills. By providing many rich experiences and deep conversations, we aim to advance children's knowledge and thinking. One of the ways that we are doing this is offering a Big Question session, supported by volunteers from the church (including one of our governors). This is an opportunity for a varied group of children to think more deeply. Our question this term is: 'Are rules important? Why?'

Do talk with your children at home about this too – it all helps develop our children's moral compass; thinking skills; and ability to articulate their thoughts.

#### Music week



As well as half the school having their usual violin, piano, guitar or recorder lessons, in addition to regular music teaching, many of our pupils have had wonderful extra musical experiences since the last newsletter.

Firstly, a group of children went to the Harting Luncheon club to sing a medley to their guests. This proved to be an extra practice for them prior to the 'Young Voices' concert at O2 on Thursday evening. We are proud of all our choir - they loved being part of



the latter: a massive children's choir performing to hundreds of parents. It was a very exciting and happy day.

Additionally, the conductor of Southern ProMusica, Jonathan Willcocks, came to school for a singing lesson with Beacon and Torberry classes. Last Tuesday afternoon (21st January), they attended one of his orchestral concerts at Chichester Festival Theatre. They were able to participate in the final song, thanks to his extra tuition.

One of our pupils was selected as a conductor at this concert – possibly because she was sitting next to Jonathan's wife, who runs our 'Yarn club'! We are really fortunate to have the Willcocks's support.

On Wednesday afternoon, Chichester Symphony Orchestra came into school to perform – another lovely concert, shared with the whole school. This also gave our most experienced strings players the chance to end the performance with a piece for us to enjoy.

We are really fortunate to have so much expertise and this helps build a musical culture across the school. We hope it inspires our children to excel and develop a lifelong enjoyment of music.
