Safeguarding Procedures – Mobile Phones

To further improve the safeguarding culture of the school, I would like to request that mobiles phones are not used on the school premises by parents/carers, including at drop off and pick up. I understand that this is a change for the school community but in order to safeguard ourselves and the children of Harting I would appreciate your support with this matter.

COVID Updates

This week the school has been reviewing its COVID Risk assessment and as a result will be making some small changes.

- 1. Whole school assemblies will now take place in The Roundhouse instead of in the playground. This will enable us to run assemblies even when it is raining whilst also ensuring sufficient ventilation to minimise the risk of any potential transmission.
- 2. At lunch time children will now be eating in the hall. There will be no more than three classes in the hall at any one time and children will sit at class specific tables, which will also be sanitised thoroughly before the next class comes in for lunch. In addition, doors and windows will be open to allow as much air flow as possible though the hall.

Phonics

This year the school is placing a significant focus on phonics and the teaching of early reading. Earlier this term I informed you that we were adopting a scheme called Phonics Bug. However, following feedback from parents, staff and children we are reviewing this programme to ensure that it right for the children of Harting School. Further details of this review will be shared in due course.
