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Happy new year!

Another term has begun and again there is plenty of exciting learning planned with several trips in the next few weeks. These include key stage two pupils going to an orchestral concert, led by the local conductor/composer Jonathan Willcocks. We are fortunate that he will be coming into school to teach the children the song that they will be singing, whilst attending.
