

Choose a project which makes you think and use your own creativity.

Project 28:

Imagine you are a scientist and you have found a cure for coronavirus:

- Write a news report releasing the information to the world
- Write a script for a newscaster to tell the world – if you have the technology (or can borrow a phone) create a video announcing the find
- Create an invitation for the award ceremony that you will be attending for finding the cure
- Design your outfit for the ceremony



Project 29:

- Design a super car or another form of transport with special features
- Draw and label it, explaining what features make it special
- List what things you will need to make a prototype
- Write a letter to Rolls Royce, or another manufacturer, to persuade them to build it for you
- Make an advert for the final vehicle
- Write a press release for its launch
- Create a brochure with different design features available eg range of colours, trims, etc



Project 30:



Design a gown for a special event

- Draw and label it, attach pieces of fabric if you have them or research those you would like to use (perhaps taking images from the internet)
- Estimate the amount of fabric, thread, buttons, etc, you might need to use for it – look up patterns on the internet – and price the cost of making it, based on your best guesses
- Draw an image of how the gown might be displayed in a shop window
- Write a letter to someone famous to persuade them to wear it to an Oscar award ceremony

Project 31:

Create a main course for your family using between 4-8 ingredients.

- Draw the plate of food and label it
- Make it, if you can and photograph it
- Write your recipe for it or an instruction sheet for a cook
- Work out how many calories there would be in it or how much fat, sugar, etc
- Work out how much it might be cost
- Write a list of ingredients in French



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Project 32

Plan a meal for someone with a special diet eg peanut free, sugar free, etc

- Write and decorate your menu
- Describe who the meal would be for and why they would enjoy it
- Cost the meal, based on information from the internet
- Write a letter to the person, explaining why this would be a healthy option for them



Project 33

Create something useful or decorative from odd items around the home

- Photograph or draw it
- Paint it, if you can, to make it look good
- Write a step-by-step guide for someone else to make the same

Project 34

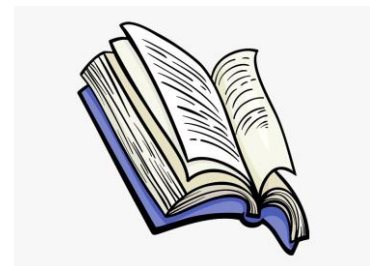
Design an ideal school building

- Draw a floor plan
- Work out the area of the building
- Write a letter from the head teacher announcing its opening
- Create a list of the equipment needed for each class
- Work out the costs of furniture needed
- Design a practical school uniform for the children
- Think of a name for the school and create a logo



Project 35

- Read a book and imagine you are one of the characters
- Write a diary of one of their days, based on the text
- Create a comic strip, based on the book
- Draw images of the character – on paper or computer



Project 36



- Read a story from the bible
- Make a puppet theatre, from a cardboard box
- Make puppets (perhaps use stick puppets and paper or card)
- Create a puppet play, based on the bible story
- Write the play script or film the play

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Project 37

- Look at 'Dea tho Knocko' by Gilbert and George
- Use the picture to tell someone else about it – get them to draw it, from what you have said. See if it looks similar
- Write a story based on the image
- Make a grid painting of your own



Project 38

- Look at 'Self-portrait with Badges' by Peter Blake
- Compare the background of the painting with the details of his clothes. Can you create an image like this of yourself?
- Write a diary of one of your days to go with your own picture
- Write a character description of either yourself or Peter Blake

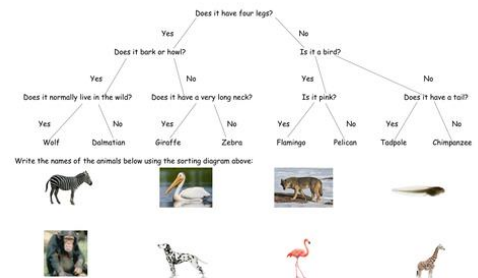


Project 39

- Create an exercise routine
- Write it down as a list of instructions
- Video yourself doing it, if you can
- Write a list of sports which you like – try writing it in French too!

Project 40

- Look round the garden and see what 'mini-beasts' you can see
- Sketch them
- Create a classification tree, which works, for someone to use to work out what each 'mini-beast' might be
- Do a tally chart of numbers of mini-beasts which you have found and present in a different way eg bar chart/frequency table



Project 41

- If you live near a road. Count the sort of vehicles going past - create a tally chart and use to present in different ways eg graph/table
- Look at a map and work out where people might be going.
- Write some instructions, using a map, for a journey to Chichester from your home
- Sketch one of the vehicles and/or the people in it
- Write a mystery story about the vehicle and people
- Make some comic strip images



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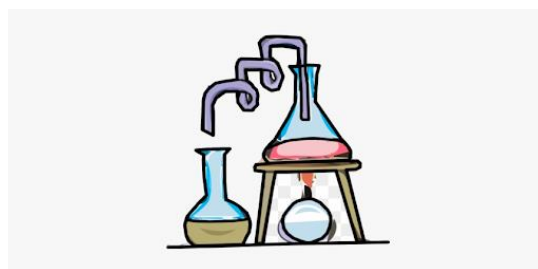
Project 42



- Look up Mohs scale – write a description of what it is used for (in your own words)
- Use the scale to test things around the house, using your finger nail or a coin to help (don't do on anything precious)
- Carve a piece of soap into a shape, which you like (check with your mum or dad first). Photograph it
- Make labels for things in the house and grade, using Mohs scale

Project 43

- Create a test for absorbency of some items eg loo roll, kitchen roll, ordinary paper and newspaper. Predict which you think is the best for mopping up spills
- Think about how best to do this (and where). Do your experiment
- Write it up, including a list of apparatus and a chart of your results
- Write an advert for the paper which is best for sopping up spills



Project 44

- Listen to a piece of music
- Dance to it or try to clap along to it
- Draw an image of what it makes you think about
- Write your own lyrics for it or create a beatbox version of it



Project 45

- Think about how lockdown has been for children – make a list of the rules
- Write an assembly to celebrate being back together
- Choose some pieces of music, which help you to feel calm
- Make a poster of ways to feel calm and happy
