<u>Maths</u>

Continue to follow the daily White Rose Maths Home activities (on our Harting website) for either Year 3 or Year 4. Keep practising your times tables. Year 3 (3s, 4s and 8s) Year 4 (up to 12s).

You could challenge yourself to the related divisions. These are trickier to chant but good for the brain eg 2 divided by 2 is 1 4 divided by 2 is 2 6 divided by 2 is 3

<u>Science</u>

Learn the names of the bones in the human skeleton. Can you make a skeleton out of objects in your house? Explore the different types and functions of teeth in your mouth (incisors, molars, canines). Can you make each type out of dough? Explore the different parts of a tooth and draw a labelled diagram. Can you invent a brushing your teeth song that lasts for 2 minutes that will clean all parts of your teeth? Research how the digestive system works.

English

Please use the Hamilton home learning site for Year 3 and Year 4. This will provide daily structured activities to practise a wide variety of English skills. Please also still try to read or listen to stories as much as you can. If you can get the book, read and share The Invention of Hugo Cabret by Brian Selznick. There is also an audio version of the book which you can listen to (although you would miss out on the graphic beauty of the book). Once you have read the book, watch the film Hugo and compare. You could try writing your own graphic nove!!
